The meeting commenced with a welcome note by Joint Secretary (HE), Ministry of Education. JS (HE) addressed the members about the importance, constitution and mandate of the committee i.e. the main attention of the Committee shall be to focus on the evils of ragging, the modalities how these can be prevented and what stern action can be taken against the persons indulging in ragging. It shall also be suggested as to what action can be taken against the educational institutions where such ragging takes place and the authorities of such institutions. It shall be open to the Committee to appoint such persons, as deemed proper, to effectively deliberate on the measures to prevent anti ragging activities at the outset. Best practices of the States may also be shared with the Committee. These practices after consideration may be disseminated to other States/HEIs.

JS(HE) requested all the members to give suggestion as to how to implement effective measure against the people who are involved in ragging and requested Chairman of the committee to deliberate upon agenda points to discuss that how committee can suggest effective measures to stop ragging activities.

On behalf of UGC, Secretary, UGC welcomed Chairman of the committee and all other members of the committee. He informed the committee that UGC is playing a key role to implement of anti-ragging regulation to curb the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions. UGC is taking all initiatives by way of guiding all universities about how to create an atmosphere where student can interact in harmonious manner so that we can minimize the incidents of ragging. Secretary, UGC informed the committee that UGC sends advisory time to time to all higher educational institutions for curbing the menace of ragging. He also informed the committee that UGC has

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developed a 24x7 anti ragging helpline, an anti-ragging call centre, a mobile application, along with monitoring agency and with the help of these UGC tries to resolve the matters of ragging to maximum possible extent in a time bound manner. Now with the able guidance of this committee, we shall be able to move further in creating better environment for students in our educational institutions and creating

better measures so that the ragging incidents can be prevented. JS (ARC), requested committee to move on to discuss the agenda items one by one:

Confirmation of Minutes of the 18th meeting of the Committee for monitoring measures to prevent ragging in higher educational institutions held on

08.06.2016.

The minutes were confirmed.

Action Taken on the last meeting of the Dr. R.K. Raghavan Committee held on 08.06.2016 and preventive measures taken by the Regulatory Authorities.

The Action Taken was noted.

Presentation was given by Prof Raj Kachroo about the monitoring mechanism

of Ragging cases.

Submission by Dr. Sarvesh Tandon, Professor, Forensic Science, Safdarjung Dr. Tandon insisted that Higher Educational Institution need more support at higher authorities' level. Good amount of awareness should be created at institutional level, Hospital: more counselling's are required. Call received for complaint should be checked, fake complaints call should be avoided. He asked Prof. Kachroo what is the criteria to check

whether case is mild or severe.

Submission by Dr. Manoj Khanna, Principal, Ramjas College, New Delhi Dr. Manoj Khanna enquired about the reason behind the cases pending from long time. He suggested to constitute an ICC like committee in all higher educational institutions for ragging also. He stressed the need to sensitize students at school level. There should be regular workshop for ragging similar to ICC for sexual harassment. Cases in some states like UP are very high, that needs to be looked carefully and

should try to reduce these cases.

Submission by Sh. V. Chandar, Sannidhi Street, Tamil Nadu The reported cases on ragging in the southern universities have come down substantially in the last decade, thanks to the severe measures adopted by all the authorities after quite a few ragging related murders in the previous periods. Same is the case in a few other states also.

The full details of such best practices which have given proven results have now to be shared to the needy States like UP and Bihar where more cases of ragging are still being reported. The scope of this committee needs to be widened from mere anti ragging (which has a limited connotation) to make it a widely encompassing positive body that can address the urgent needs of the behavioural enhancement qualities of youth. Youth related social issues such as eve teasing, youth disobedience and indiscipline, crime against women, campus unrest etc. have to be viewed in a holistic view for surmounting with a clarity on their fundamental root causes. There is dire need to closely observe and monitor the psychological and mental makeup of the youth in their formative early teen age itself. As proactive and preventive measure, school syllabuses need to be widened broadly from the class tenth onwards and Behavioural Enhancement Counselling Sessions need to be provided to them to groom their mental make-up in the positive directions. The identified black sheeps in each class have to be given closer correctional attentions. Educational syllabus for teachers need to be revised to include enriched contents that enable and empower them for boosting their behavioural counselling skills for motivation, concentration, empathy, respect, care and concern for fellow students especially of the other gender etc. A subcommittee can be created to dwell deep into each of the above points and give more specific practical guidelines to the government for future implementation.

Submission by Sh. K.L Prasad, IPS (Retd), Mumbai

Awareness should be created at School level (9th, 10th standard). It will give a behavioural change from the beginning. There should be debates, tv shows, activities at school level.

Submission by JS (HE)

JS (HE) suggested to have Information Education Communication (IEC) Kit, E-content on abatement of ragging. There should be training programmes in the form of refresher, orientation courses, training of faculty, student awareness programmes and sensitization drives in educational institutions. She stressed for more support and counselling system required for capacity building of the faculty and sensitization of the students as well. Besides penal provisions may be mentioned specifically for ragging activities in the IEC literature. The following initiatives/actions may also be taken:-

(i) Sharing of best practices by States.

(ii) Inviting UGC/AICTE and other Regulatory bodies as special invitees whenever

(iii) Data of FIRs registered to review the status of severe cases. required.

(iv) The Regulations/Guidelines, IEC material and best practices of Department of Higher Education in respect of anti-ragging activities may also be shared with

Department of School Education & Literacy for awareness purposes. (v) For effective implementation of anti-ragging provisions, Regulatory bodies may be requested to monitor the compliance of points as per the checklist meant for HEIs.

Submission by the Chairman of the committee

Chairman appreciated the role of UGC has been playing in abatement of Ragging programme. He stressed

- a. Monitoring mechanism needs to be strengthened so that a swift and transparent redressal mechanism is there.
- b. Timely disposal of pending cases and states having more than 100 cases should be sensitized about quality disposal of cases.
- c. Verification mechanism should be there to understand whether the complaint has been dealt properly or not.

The Committee desired that the Anti-ragging Monitoring Agency should identify the institutions which were lagging behind in Anti-ragging and share the same with regulatory bodies. The Committee desired that this may be done early. Prof. Kachroo mentioned that the Agency was frequently sending mails to all concerned on Anti-ragging and also using social media for Anti-ragging.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
